## Re: Request for an Independent Public Hearing Process Regarding the Grouse Complex (McDougall Creek) Wildfire

The Grouse Complex (McDougall Creek) Wildfire in 2023 was an extremely intense wildfire impacting five jurisdictions within the Central Okanagan Regional District (RDCO).

We are grateful to the RDCO and local government staff who worked tirelessly at the Emergency Operations Centre (EOC), and to the many Emergency Support Services (ESS) volunteers who worked very long days with great compassion under strenuous conditions.

West Kelowna City Council understands that it is the intention of the RDCO to be engaged and involved with various opportunities for post-wildfire reviews, which we trust will lead to constructive and positive outcomes. Of particular concern is the challenge to effectively deliver the BC Provincial ESS program. We believe there is great merit in hearing the lived experiences from the public, from City administration and from community volunteers who served at the ESS.

At the October 10, 2023 Regular Council Meeting, Council passed the attached Resolution (C340/23) to be sent to the RDCO for consideration. We strongly encourage the RDCO to consider, as part of the review of the Grouse Complex (McDougall Creek) Wildfire, our request for an independent Public Hearing Process with a focus on Emergency Support Services and the effectiveness of the RDCO Emergency Plan.
