






Purpose


To amend the zoning bylaw fencing regulations to allow finished corrugated metal to be used if exposed edges are framed with another material.

Proposed Fencing Amendment

3.10.11 Prohibited Fence Materials

- a) No fence in an *R zone*, *R3 zone*, or *C zone* shall contain barbed wire, razor wire, electrified wire, **unfinished** corrugated metal or sheet metal.
- b) No fence in an *RU* or A1 *zone* shall contain tarps, razor wire, **unfinished** corrugated metal or sheet metal.
- d) Finished corrugated metal may only be used as a fencing material if exposed edges are capped or framed with other materials.

No restriction on corrugated metal*

Lake Country

No restriction on corrugated metal*

City of West Kelowna

- Corrugated metal prohibited in rural or agricultural zones

- <u>Unfinished</u> corrugated metal prohibited in other zones

District of Peachland

- No restriction on corrugated metal
