**Purpose:** To consider Regional Board support for staff to apply for a grant under the Union of BC

Municipalities (UBCM) Community Emergency Preparedness Fund (CEPF) for

Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) Equipment and Training.

#### **Executive Summary:**

The Community Emergency Preparedness Fund (CEPF) is a plethora of funding programs to enhance the resiliency of local governments, First Nations, and communities in responding to emergencies.

Emergency Management staff have prepared a regional application to request grant funding and subsequently pool funds for Emergency Operations Centre Equipment and Training. Grant funds will be used for Emergency Operations Centre training complete with tabletop exercises and mock activations, communications training for the Public Information Officers, team building within the EOC, and mental health & wellness training.

## Recommendation(s):

**THAT** the Regional Board supports a submission of an application under the Union of BC Municipalities - Community Emergency Preparedness Fund up to a maximum of \$240,000 under the Emergency Operations Centre Equipment and Training 2025 funding stream.
