

- Wildlife viewing in a variety of ecosystems




Initial Public Engagement

Weaknesses


- Many unsanctioned trails
- Wayfinding is challenging
- Shortage of washrooms, benches, picnic shelters, water receptacles etc.

Opportunities

- Establish park as an indigenous storytelling hub for the region
- Revitalize the East Park Area to increase park activities and amenities for public use over a larger area
- Connect to Kelowna's active transportation network
- Increase nature-based play for children of all ages
- Develop an area off of Hall Road to improve access and amenities in Sutherland Hills

Threats

- Effects of climate change



- Create an inclusive and accessible place for gathering and outdoor recreation


Park Use by Management Zone



Trail Network

Improvements to enhance the user experience and preserve the park:

- Establish a clear hierarchy of trails
- Anticipate trail users desire lines
- A park-wide unified signage strategy
- Decommission redundant trails
- Maintain trail surface to park standard
- Place key amenities on trails at strategic locations
- Connect to active transportation network
- Educate user on shared multi-use trail etiquette





Management Goals & Recommendations

Environment and Conservation

Protect, conserving and enhancing wildlife habitat by reducing the impact of the trail network and park maintenance on critical habitat

Action #10: Create an Ecological Restoration Plan for the park that includes a detailed weed management strategy

Action #14: Explore the provision of viewing areas and platforms that prevent human entry into spawning habitat

Recreation and Access

Provide a variety of positive park experiences to people of all abilities

Action #25: Focus existing & future programming, infrastructure and recreation to less sensitive and/or already disturbed areas.

Action #40: Provide picnic shelters near the EECO, East Park and in the Hall Road Parking Area to provide shade and cover

Stewardship and Partnerships

Engage new park conservation and restoration activities in research and the arts

Action 49: Pursue programming opportunities with local academic research/institutions, Westbank First Nation and community organizations

Education and Interpretation

Provide high-quality environmental and cultural interpretation in the Central Okanagan

Action #54: Minimize wildlife conflicts by including prevention and mitigation information in interpretative programs

Human Safety and Security

Offer a safe user experience

Action #62: Design and develop the park in a manner that minimizes or deters inappropriate activities and is in keeping with current Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CEPTED) principles
