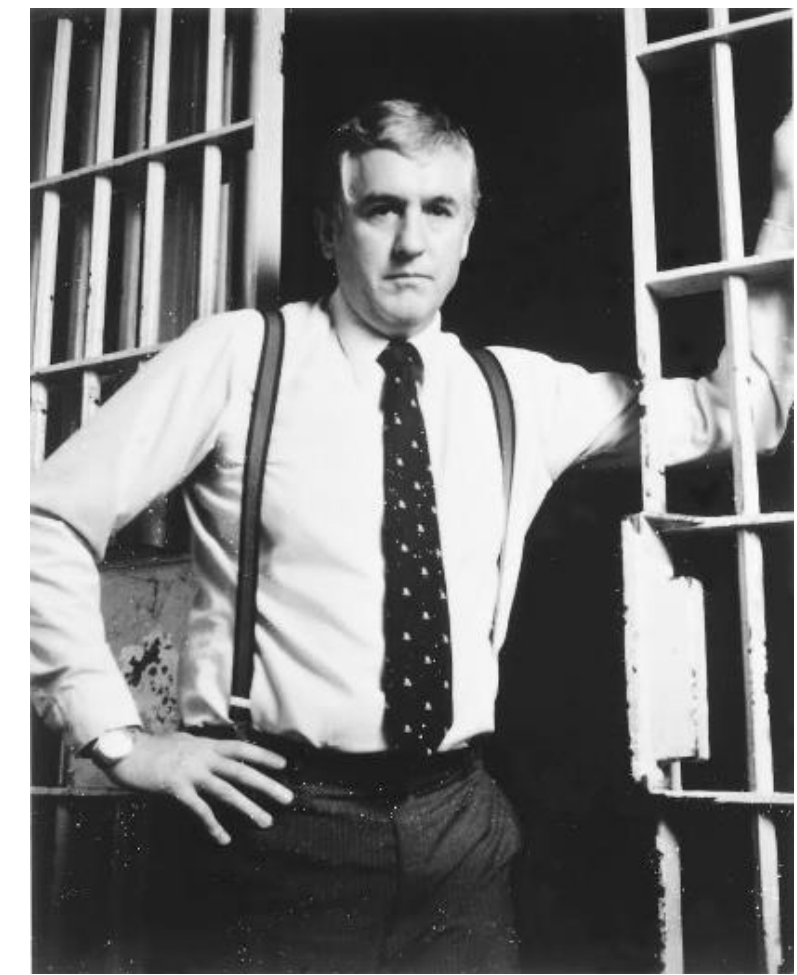

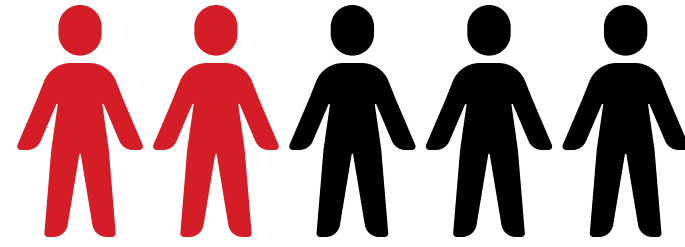


How did it start?

A college student was shot to death during a robbery in 1976 at a gas station in Albuquerque, New Mexico. It seemed that the death would remain a mystery until young Detective Greg MacAleese encouraged the public to get involved. He conceived the idea of a video re-enactment offering anonymity and a reward from his own pocket. It worked. Within a few hours of the broadcast, a tip was received that helped solve the murder case and a string of armed robberies.

We use a secure tip software called P3 that is used by our staff and investigative partners



Rewards up to \$2000 are paid when a tip leads to an arrest or charges

Unsolved Crimes

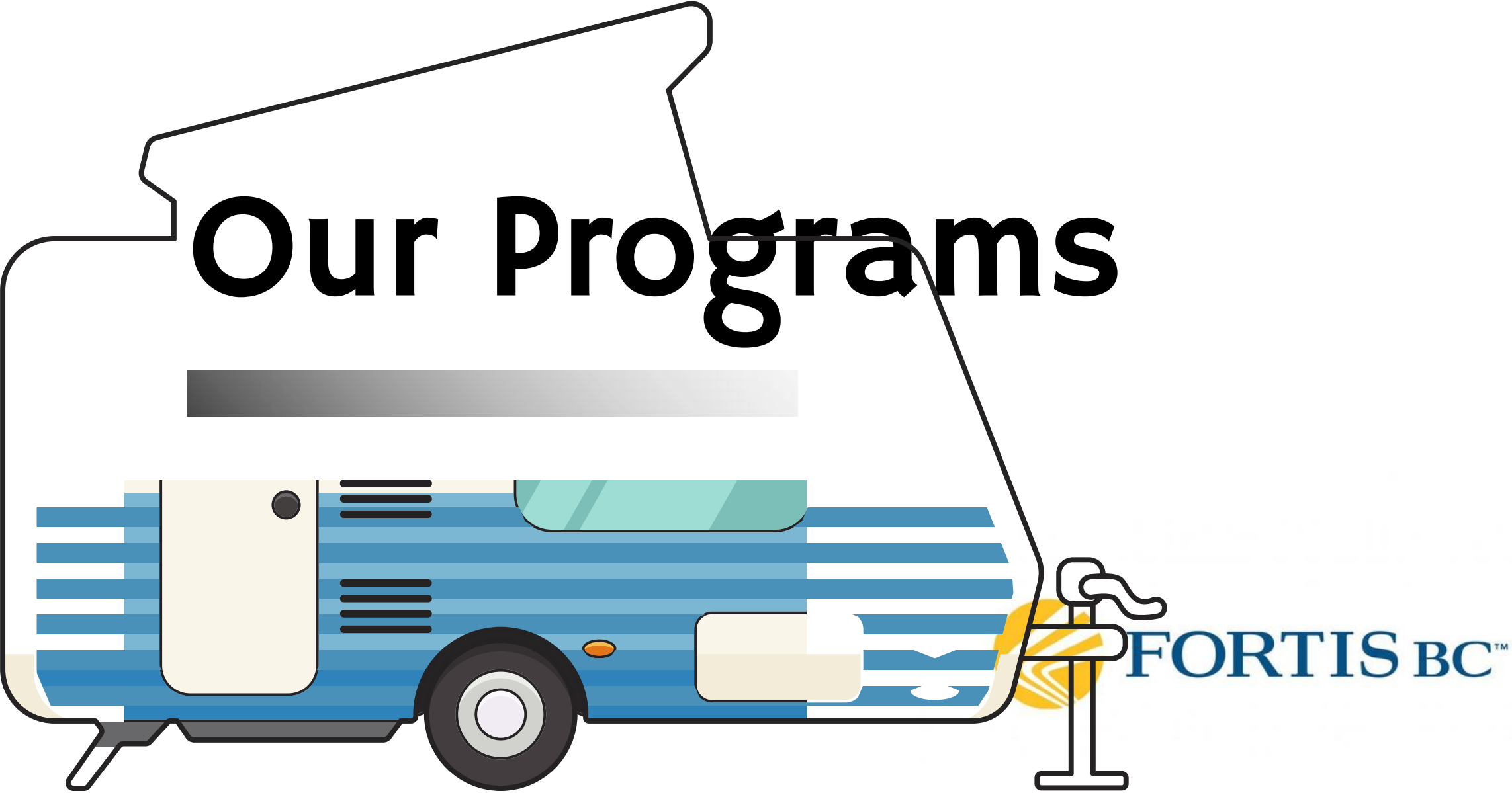
We feature local crimes on media outlets to aid RCMP in their investigations.

Our website has information on stolen recreational vehicles such as motorcycles, ATV's, trailers and boats.

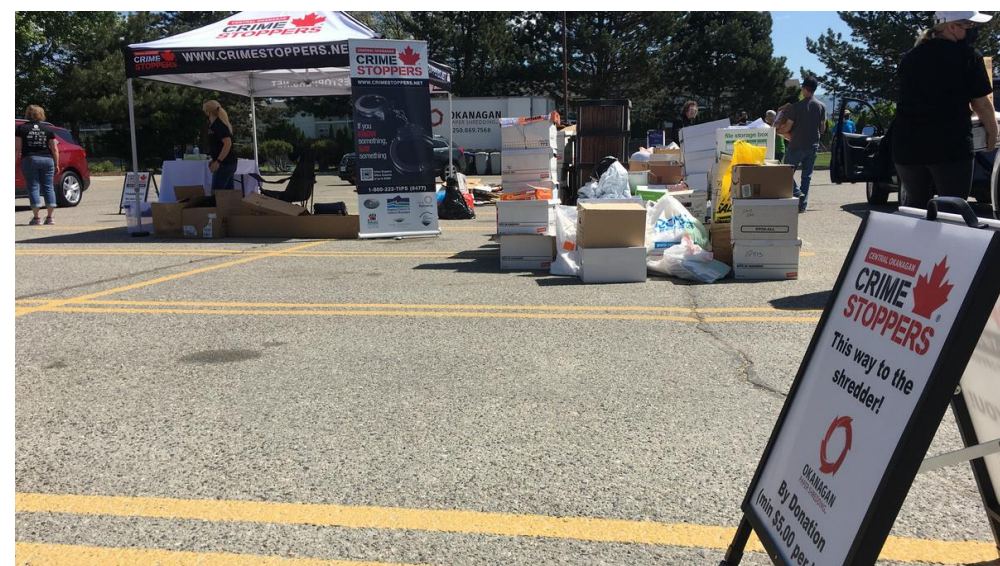
Energy Theft
